● Dr. David Willey

Dr. David Willey is the Unit Director of the Substance Use Disorders Unit at Cottonwood Springs Behavioral Health Hospital in Olathe, Kansas. He is a graduate of the University of Kansas Medical Center where he completed his general psychiatry training and a fellowship specializing in Addiction Psychiatry. Dr. Willey has received numerous honors and recognition for his work with various organizations and institutions in the effort to address substance use issues and the opioid epidemic.



● Dr. Mali Bullard

Dr. Mali Bullard is a Counseling Psychologist and the Director of Clinical Services at Cottonwood Springs Hospital. She received her doctorate in Counseling Psychology from the University of Kansas in 2007. She completed her doctoral internship at the University of Missouri-Kansas City and her postdoctoral residency at the Kansas City VA Medical Center. Her initial 8 years as a licensed psychologist were focused on integrated treatment of PTSD and SUD while serving as the PTSD/SUD Specialist for the Kansas City VA Medical Center, until she transitioned to working with the residential SUD treatment program and then eventually to the Program Manager for the Substance Use Disorders Treatment programs. She transitioned to Cottonwood Springs to work with the Clinical Services team in October 2017. Dr. Bullard has an interest in training and supervision. Her commitment toward treating substance use disorders and PTSD developed during her graduate school education and has continued to be a focus of her professional career. Thus, she has a passion for Prolonged Exposure Therapy, Cognitive Processing Therapy, Motivational Interviewing and Motivational Enhancement Therapy, as well as Relapse Prevention and other Cognitive Approaches to SUD recovery.
