SMALL GROUP TIME!

Getting Started

Supplies Needed: Pipe Cleaners, Mini-containers of Play Dough, Google Eyes, Paper, Markers, Gum

Say: We are talking about loyalty today and when we think about loyalty one of the first things that comes to mind are dogs. Dogs are super loyal they stick with their owners!

Instructions:

- Hand out a piece of gum for anyone who would like to chew one. Tell them we'll be using it later!
- Divide into groups of 2 or 3
- Hand out supplies to each group: (5 pipe cleaners, 1 container of mini-play dough, google eyes, one piece of paper and one marker)
- You will have 5-7 minutes to create a dog out of the supplies you have been given.
- After creating the dog on the piece of paper you must answer the following questions: "What is your dog's name? What is one amazing thing your dog can do? Your dog can say 3 words; what are they?"
- After 5-7 minutes call time and let groups show off their new dogs.

Ask these 2 questions:

- 1. What makes a dog an awesome pet?
- 2. Do you think being loyal is easy or hard to do?

Say: Being loyal is an important part of friendship. Life does not always go the way we want. Sometime when we have a bad day that is when we need a friend the most. Jonathan showed loyalty to David even when his father, Saul, was trying to hurt him. Let's think a little more about David and Jonathan for a few minutes.

Explore the Bible Story

Supplies Needed: Index card with verses on them, plain index cards, pens/markers, 3 dice

Say: For a couple of chapters in the Bible; Jonathan showed his loyalty to David over and over again.

Instructions:

- Divide into groups of 2-3.
- Hand each group an index card with a scripture verse on them. Each group should have a different card. (Verses Are: 1 Samuel 18:1; 1 Samuel 20:2,4; 1 Samuel 20:17; 1 Samuel 20:34; 1 Samuel 20:42). Also hand each group a blank index card with a pen.
- The leader rolls the dice; whatever number is rolled that is the number of words every group must use to rewrite the verse. (If you roll a total of 5 or less re-roll)
- Groups will read the verse and then re-write the verse on the blank card in their own words but only using the number of words from the dice roll! Focusing on the loyalty of Jonathan.
- Give kids 3-4 minutes to rewrite the verse.
- Call time and allow kids to share their rewrite.

SMALL GROUP TIME!

Ask These Questions:

- 1-When do you think it was hardest for Jonathan to show loyalty to David?
- 2-Why is loyalty important in friendships?
- 3-Can you think of a situation when you needed to show loyalty to a friend?

Apply It:

Supplies Needed: Poster board strips, saltine crackers, glue, gum, honey, wet wipes

Say: Another word for loyalty is sticky or sticking together. We have a few sticky items in our bag, let's see which one is the stickiest!

Instructions:

- Give everyone three saltine crackers
- Have them apply glue to one cracker, honey to the other, and some *chewed up* gum to the next.
- Everyone sticks their crackers to the poster board.
- Once all crackers are on the poster board flip the board upside down and see which crackers stick the longest.
- You can even have some volunteers hold the poster board upside down while you ask these final questions:

Ask These Questions:

- 1. On a scale of 1-10, with 10 being the best, how good are you at being a loyal a friend?
- 2. On a scale of 1-10, with 10 being the easiest, how easy is it for you to be loyal?
- 3. Is there someone you need to stick with who might need help? It could be a friend you already have or someone new you met.
- 4. We all go through tough times and to have someone by our side makes those tough times a little easier. Where would David have been without Jonathan in our story?

The Bible tells us that Jesus is a friend that never leaves us. We all have at least one loyal friend and that is Jesus!

Final Challenge & Prayer

Thank Jesus for never leaving us. Jesus is a faithful friend. Think about someone who might need your friendship right now. Think about how you can be loyal to your friends.

Take a moment and pray together before finishing up. You can say a prayer yourself, ask a student to pray, or if there is time, see if anyone has a prayer request before praying together.
